Did You Know?

1

Mary Magdalene (Hebrew: מרים המגדלית, original Greek: *Μαρία ἡ Μαγδαληνή*), travelled with Jesus as one of his followers.

2

Her name means either 'Mary from Magdala', 'Mary the Tower' or 'Tall Mary'.

3

There are several Marys in the NT –

- Mary the mother of Jesus;
- Mary of Bethany, sister of Martha and Lazarus;
- Mary the mother of James and Joseph; &
- Mary the wife of Cleopas.

- There are two unnamed women who are expressly identified in the NT as sexual sinners –
- the woman who anointed Jesus' feet with costly perfume, &
 - an adulteress who the Pharisees brought before Jesus to see if he would condemn her.

Mary was one of the most common Hebrew name in NT times. So because someone named Mary was a prostitute doesn't mean that it's referring to Mary Magdalene.

Ideas that go beyond the gospel presentation of Mary Magdalene as a prominent representative of the women who followed Jesus have been put forward over the centuries but are speculative.

7

Speculation hinges on Jesus casting demons out of Mary Magdalene prior to her becoming one of his followers.

The Gospel of Luke says seven demons had gone out of her [Luke 8:2] and the longer ending of Mark agrees with this [Mark 16:9].

There's no precedence to believe that when demons were cast out of a person they were spirits of sexual addiction or of sexual immorality.

Why then, in the case of Mary Magdalene, do we imagine that the spirits Jesus cast out were these type?

So, do the Gospels really support the notion that Mary Magdalene was once a prostitute?

The answer is: “**NO**”.
