

Part of the Process Involved in Becoming a Son of 'The Kingdom'

(Transcript of prophetic teaching received as a download and recorded on 5-4-2017)

[NOTE: This is not a prophecy]

“If you say "But..." to anything I say, or to any message that you are given about the Kingdom, you are being adversarial. This is your mind, your soul and your 'self' interjecting itself into a spiritual experience. Kingdom citizens are spiritual people and they hear with their spirit. When you "But", you switch off your spirit, and you are unable to take in what has been said. You're unable to evaluate it, you're unable to be impacted by it – impartation from the spirit is cancelled.

When you listen with your spirit, you are listening for what 'sits' in your spirit, not in your mind, not in your heart, but your spirit. And, you can calmly reject anything that doesn't sit, anything that doesn't align with your theology. You can let it 'go through to the keeper' because it's irrelevant.

If the Spirit wants to teach you something, you will learn through your spirit. While ever you continue to learn through your mind, you will not get spiritual impartation. While ever your emotions and your soul and your 'self' get in the way, you are negating Kingdom communication. So, whenever anyone is talking to you, watch for your 'hackles' going up to what they said. If your 'hackles' rise – that is, if you feel anger, resentment, etc, arising within you – kill it straight away, it is not your spirit.

If you want to become a Kingdom son with full understanding of the Kingdom, you're going to have to be able to hear with your spirit, you're going to have to learn how to discern, and you're going to have to strongly desire – that is covet – the Spirit's impartation to you. But that can't happen while ever you are hanging onto your current or old theological, religious or personal beliefs. To put on Kingdom 'glasses' – that is, to have a complete Kingdom worldview that's identical to Father's – you have to be prepared to throw absolutely everything out and allow him to retrain you. If you can't, it's going to be a very slow process, a process that may never get anywhere. If it does, it will be over a long period of time and you may not completely understand what you need to know by the time your time in your body is up.

The Kingdom is the most important concept in Heaven. It's all about spiritual authority, who is in charge, and how we relate to the person in charge. Kingdom sons need to know everything there is to know about the Kingdom, which includes: all about Jesus and his character; all about Father and his character; all about Holy Spirit and his character. The way they function; their relationships to each other and to you; how you fit into the spirit realm; how you fit into Earth; what's your destiny; what you were placed on this planet for; what your scroll says; and of supreme importance as a son, how do you align with Father.

It's not about religion, where: the Bible says this therefore we have to; or God said this, therefore we have to; or the Law says this and therefore we have to (as in the Torah Law). It's about being in Father's family and relaxing and resting in him and being about his business. If you're ignorant of Kingdom knowledge, you won't be able to align with Heaven. Father won't be able to trust you with things because he can't explain them to you. He won't be able to give you specific assignments because you'll object or you'll put up a barrier or you'll switch off, because you haven't learnt to totally surrender your mind, your will, your emotions, to the Supreme Being of the universe.

He wants to draw you in. Father wants to work with you as a son. Our King wants to work with you like an overseer. He wants to train you to be a king, to administrate on the face of the Earth. But he can't do that until you learn to be a son, and you can't learn to be a son until you realise that being a son has got nothing to do with Christianity and nothing to do with religion and nothing to do with you. Being a son is about being molded and shaped, to operate and to think and to speak and to be and to go and to do as a son is supposed to. Jesus is the prototype. Admittedly, he had a specific task to do so we can't copy everything, but his sonship needs to become our sonship.

That's pretty scary and most believers pull back at this stage and say, "Oh, it's all too much", or "How can I do those things that he did?" There are others who are *gung ho* and say "Yep, I'll do all that. I've got to manifest the Kingdom", without going through the process to become a son. Do you realise that Jesus went through a 30-year training period before he was released into his ministry? He might have been standing in the temple releasing revelation to the religious leaders when he was a young lad, but he wasn't ready. He had to learn so much. He had to learn, for a start, submission to his earthly father and mother. Complete surrender to them, complete submission to them, so that Father could trust him to be totally submitted to him. He set the benchmark: 30 years of training.

Now he was a man who had the spirit of the Son of God and who was anointed just before his ministry with the Holy Spirit. So the 30 years were about him learning as a man, putting aside what he knew in his spirit, but as a man he had to go through the process. There's no indication that he wanted to 'jump the gun', that he wanted to "get out now" and start his ministry following his trip to Jerusalem that's recorded in scripture. It was in those 30 years that he had to bring his flesh, his soul and his mind into order so that he could be meek and humble, but at the same time capable of wielding the full power of Heaven.

So, there is much that we need to know and there is much we need to become. Surrendering to the process and learning to enjoy the process and putting aside our desires, ceasing to let our emotions manipulate what we do and what we get involved in, and let the time go past. Father's not in a rush. Two thousand years it's taken for him to get things ready for his Son. A few more years for his selected sons to get themselves ready are not an issue for him.

It's all up to us. To become the manifested sons of God takes time, metamorphosis and the gaining of much knowledge and experience."

ADDENDUM

There are those believers who try to assess everything that is taught through their mental filter. This is not discernment, but rather a form of critiquing. These people will often do 2 of a number of things in response to what they hear: (1) Interject and pull the speaker up; or (2) Become critical and reject the speaker so that nothing else impacts them. These people are operating out of a critical spirit which is epitomised by their staunchness about particular theologies and their willingness to be confrontational about them. A critical spirit is not evidence of maturity in the Spirit or of progress as a Kingdom son.

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
