AIM

To properly align with the restoration of the Apostolic in the worldwide church today.

OUTCOMES

At the conclusion of the course participants:

1. Will understand the difference between 'apostle' and 'apostolic'.
2. Will understand the necessity of the apostolic today.
3. Will understand the breadth of the usage and functionality of 'apostle' and 'apostolic'.
4. Will have made the important link between 'sonship' and the apostolic.
5. Will come to appreciate that apostolic leadership brings freedom rather than bondage & control.
6. Should have begun to align themselves with Father's current apostolic restoration.
7. Are expected to be eagerly seeking God's role for them in the apostolic move of these times.

VENUE

Sessions will be conducted at:

STRUCTURE

Each night is a 1-hour session. This is followed by an optional 1-hour period for supper and discussion.

LENGTH

The course runs for 4 sessions which will be covered over 4 weeks.

Extension Option: The course has the option of extending to 6, 8 or 10 weeks to cover more content. This will be decided once lessons begin and participants express a desire for more learning on the topic.

The structure of one session per week allows for the processing and activation of what has been covered each night. Participants will also have ample time to complete the background reading during the week.

STYLE

Each session will have the following components:

1. Background reading (*at home or elsewhere*)
2. Background listening (*at home or elsewhere*)
3. Oral and multimedia teaching
4. Questions and answers
5. Discussion
6. Informal fellowship

Background reading covers a chapter out of the textbook prior to the start of every session.

The **background listening** is optional and is a lecture on the Apostolic topic which should be done at home.

At the start of each session there will be **oral and multimedia teaching** that will reinforce what has been covered in the textbook chapter. Additional topics are also covered here to give more breadth to the acquired knowledge.

Questions and answers are addressed each night. Proposed questions are best written down rather than given off-the-cuff. These questions should relate to the readings, but they can also be those that arise from the Apostolic journey that participants are on.

At the conclusion of each session there will be a time of **informal fellowship** over supper which develops into discussion time.

Discussion time is for each participant to give input and briefly share experiences. It will also be a time for the airing of concerns and difficulties of understanding.
