Here's 3 reasons why it matters what others think of you:

## 1) Favour

When God guides you to a new acquaintance and they look at you, they will associate you with someone or something positive. That's when the favour touches your connection.

"Favor is like a divine covering and makes a powerful first impression."

## 2) The Law of Attraction

Draw around yourself people whom resonate with the vision you carry. When you do this you will be moving with the flow of the Kingdom. Those who are ideal for you will pick up on your presence and connect with you. These are God's divine appointments for you – not a chance happening. A series of divine moves will bring this about.

## 3) Discernment
