

### (1) The Aftermath of The Fall

God stated his plan to return the lost kingdom back to men using a man (the "seed" of a woman) to take it back from Satan <u>legally</u>.

SEE Genesis 3:15

He always complies with his law of Spiritual Authority

Genesis 4 to Revelation 22 is the redemptive program God chose before creation to accomplish the restoration of his kingdom on Earth through redemption

SEE 1 Peter 1:20; Luke 21:28; Romans 8:23; Ephesians 1:7; Hebrews 9:12

## The end result of this restoration will be the <u>reappearance</u> of the Sons of God on Earth at a time in the future

SEE Romans 8:19; Luke 20:35-36

# The Watchers, Nephilim, giants and flood incidents

### Very critical, but not covered here

Noah was given God's 7 <u>permanent</u> laws for mankind and he taught them to his descendants – we call them the Noahide Laws →

SEE Genesis 9:2-7

- 1. Do not worship idols
- 2. Do not commit blasphemy
- 3. Do not murder
- 4. Do not commit sexual sins
- 5. Do not steal
- 6. Do not eat blood or flesh cut from a living animal
- 7. Do establish courts of justice



## Noah was recommissioned with the Reproductive Mandate

SEE Genesis 9:1

Noah was never reissued with the **Dominion Mandate**.

SEE Genesis 9:1-3

Abraham, like Noah, was considered righteous by God.

This was by faith, not the law.  $\rightarrow$ 

"For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the Law, but through the righteousness produced by faith."

Romans 4:13 (ISV)

There is no biblical cross-reference for this assertion of Paul's.

The precedent must be considered to be the re-inheritance of the Earth as the reward of a faithful, righteous son.

Abraham could not reclaim the lost kingdom because it already had a legal ruler, Satan.

It must, therefore, fall to some future descendant of his to reclaim it so that it would become his.

"One from [the descendants of] Jacob shall have **dominion** and will destroy the remnant from the city."

Numbers 24:19 (AMP)

#### The coming One – Messiah:

"For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

Isaiah 9:6 (NKJV)

#### An interesting point:

"[B]oth Israel and Israel's land will be used by God to bless all people groups of the world, not just with salvation but blessings to the whole earth (Gen. 12:2-3; 22:17-18; Isa. 2:2-4; Ps. 72:18-19 Zech. 9:10). As Israel is blessed, ultimately through the Messiah, blessings will spill over to other nations and their lands. →

Isaiah 27:6 states: 'In the days to come Jacob will take root, Israel will blossom and sprout, and they will fill the whole world with fruit'. Thus, Israel and Israel's land function as microcosms of what God will do for all nations and their lands. As God blesses Israel, blessings will come to other nations (see Isaiah 19:15-25)."

# Everything about Israel is a type or shadow – i.e. they 'prophesied' the future

Israel, their leaders, and their events were all shadows of things to come.

They were pointing to the 'real deal'.

"Therefore let no one judge you in regard to food and drink or in regard to [the observance of a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day. Such things are only a shadow of what is to come and they have only symbolic value; but the substance [the reality of what is foreshadowed] belongs to Christ." Colossians 2:16-17 (AMP)

#### Check this out too:

"For since the Law has only a shadow [just a pale representation] of the good things to come—not the very image of those things—it can never, by offering the same sacrifices continually year after year, make perfect those who approach [its altars]." Hebrews 10:1 (AMP)





## Israel's time in Egypt was a shadow of mankind's history

Israel in Canaan – Humanity in Eden

**Israel in bondage** – The world system is oppressive

Joseph's rule – God supernaturally supplies a deliver



God's Egyptian plagues – The deliverer overpowers the kingdom of darkness

No plagues in Goshen – Believer's are not under a curse

Passover – The deliverer protects his people



Israel plunders Egypt – The world finances the Kingdom

### (4) Israel – Kingdom Model

## So, God used Abraham to set up a prototype of the lost Kingdom

Ruler ('king') – Abraham & sons
 Domain – The land of Canaan
 Dominion – Given territory & people
 Subjects – A new nation of people

SEE Genesis 12:1-3,7; 17:6-8



Abraham's name given to him by God.

- •Scripture states God said he would be "the father of many nations" that is an English <u>translational statement</u>.
- His name can mean: 'Ruler/chief of a multitude of people'.

  Genesis 17:5

A ruler is a king or an emperor

#### Israel's name given to him by God.

- Scripture states God said "he struggled with God and men and prevailed" that is not the meaning of his name.
- •It means: 'He will rule as God'.

A ruler is a king

Genesis 32:28



#### **Kingdom law:**

The Law, societal rules, and national standards were set by the rulers from information given to them from God (The 'King of All Things')

SEE Exodus to Deuteronomy

Each Israelite person was to have direct fellowship with God.

They rejected this for a spokesman instead.

SEE Exodus 20:18-21

Israel was to have a flat organisational structure with God as the head.

There were to be no over-lording kings.

SEE 1 Samuel 8

Israel was to serve as a parakingdom (outside kingdom) until the real one could return This was a temporary arrangement that symbolized how the real one would operate and become available to all humanity through Israel The real Kingdom could not come at that time because the Governor (Holy Spirit) could not reside in men any more due to their sin-nature

There are 4 reasons why a prototype of the Kingdom was demonstrated by Israel →

(i) To show all the world the benefits of the Kingdom, where everyone submits to God's rulership (ii) To re-establish a system of protocols where God could influence Earth again with his plans & purposes through men – according to the Genesis 1:26 mandate

(iii) To set up a model that reintroduced the concept of government by God

(iv) To reintroduce men to their proper status of being royal priests and citizens of Heaven

## Israel was never about Judaism (the Jewish religion)

## It was always about a nation with a Kingdom form of government


Genesis 18:18; 28:4; Exodus 6:4; 12:49; Leviticus 19:33

### (5) Israel – Kingdom Priests

Israel was to be a kingdom of priests, a nation set apart to serve Almighty God.

A priest has connection with God, not religious activity.

# "And you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation."

Exodus 19:6 (NKJV)

This is **the same function** as the believers who came after the Old Covenant, who <u>are</u> in The Kingdom →

"But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people...

1 Peter 2:9 (NKJV)

"And formed us into a <u>kingdom (a royal race)</u>, <u>priests</u> to His God and Father...

Revelation 1:6 (AMPC)

### (6) Israel – Satan Nullified

Satan still had the title deed to Earth, but Jehovah sovereignly protected Israel from his mayhem

That didn't mean that sin, iniquity and transgression couldn't manifest in Israel

Nationally any deviant behaviour was covered by ritual sacrifice.

Satan's evil was negated in these cases.

Leviticus 4

Individually, any deviant behaviour was covered by ritual sacrifice.

Satan's evil was negated in these cases also.

Leviticus 4

Sacrifices were an outward display of a penitent heart.

A sacrifice could only cover sins if the person/nation had this attitude.

The judicial system dealt with any evil that was not rectified between Israelites

God would deal with the whole nation when leaders, priests or the bulk of commoners sinned by turning from him.

This occurred as a national punishment, of which there were many types.

God's favour and protective hand was removed when the nation sinned.

Satan was given permission to cause destruction which God specified.

# Punishment was often meted out by God himself through his mighty angels.

## (7) Israel – A Community

## Israel was to be a community which reflected the 'nation' of Heaven

Genesis 28:3

A community is not a religion, but spiritual beliefs do play a role in them

Judaism took over as the focus of the Israeli community, but it wasn't intended to be that way.

A community forms when people have something in common to unify them.

A community is unified when there is a shared culture which has a common set of rules, expectations, standards, social norms, responsibilities, behaviours and beliefs

# Israel's uniqueness was to be the national identity as the unique people of Almighty God.

Exodus 19:5; Deuteronomy 26:18

A community develops out of a culture that forms when any kingdom colonizes a territory.

This is what the Jews did wherever they went.

In Kingdom community it costs a person everything – including individual privacy and independence.

Even sins of a single individual can have an effect on the whole community – including prosperity and destiny.

### (8) Israel – Failure

Israel failed to be a kingdom submitted to the rulership of God.

They were no different to the pagan nations.

#### **Check this out:**

"So you shall say to them, 'This is a nation that does not obey the voice of the Lord their God nor receive correction. Truth has perished and has been cut off from their mouth."

Jeremiah 7:28 (NKJV)
