

# Meditating on 'The Word' or a Search for Truth and Reality?

*[A transcript from a recording of the second of two presentations of my teaching on this topic]*

**Bear with me in this document. Don't switch off because you think it's heresy.  
Read it all through and you'll see what I was getting at.**

## **Part 2**

You will notice I didn't use the term "meditate" or "meditating" in part 1 of this teaching. Also, I haven't used the expression "meditating on the Word of God". The reason I haven't used those terms is that I'm being reprogrammed to think from a Kingdom perspective. In other words, I'm developing a Kingdom worldview, not a biblical worldview or a Christian worldview – or for that matter, a church worldview. This is essential if we're going to be able to receive everything that Heaven has to give us in the form of knowledge, wisdom and understanding. If we don't allow ourselves to be fully reprogrammed, so there's no religion or legalism, we won't be able to accept the eternal knowledge of Heaven that's our prerogative and our right as sons to receive.

We like to quote Jesus who said, "All authority in Heaven and Earth is given to me, and I give it to you". Do you realise that all the knowledge of Heaven, of the Spirit realm and the natural realm, are ours as well? As sons, we have the right to receive those. Part of having authority is having the knowledge that goes with it, because you can't operate in authority without full knowledge. Now, I'm not trying to twist Jesus' words to justify what I'm saying. However, the Christian religion has narrowed down our knowledge to church dogma, biblical concepts and theology.

It's important that we realise that Jesus said, "My sheep will hear my voice". He didn't say, "They will read my book". You see, the Kingdom is different to Christianity. Christianity is a religion. What do I mean by that? I mean, it's a system set up by man so believers do what they think God wants them to do or what they think pleases God. It's also doing things out of fear – especially the fear of upsetting God and invoking his wrath.

There's so much we don't understand about Father's plans for us, and we can't find that out while we limit what we receive as spiritual food. We have to learn to hear from Heaven. We have to learn to be in spirit-to-spirit communication 24/7, just like Jesus of Nazareth. Instead, we're taught that we've got to read the Bible so God can speak to us. But, from a Kingdom perspective, meditating on scripture is immature, it's infantile, it's baby food. Even using the Bible to allow God to speak to you is adolescent, in the least.

Remember, Jesus is our prototype. He didn't advocate that we read the Bible all day, every day. He never mentioned it. Sure he quoted from it, but that's because he was speaking to religious people. When he read from it in the synagogue, he was again in front of religious people. Numerous times he had to correct their understanding by saying, "You've heard it said, but I say" & "It is written, but I say". We must get the Kingdom understanding and perspective on everything, and that only happens when we receive wisdom, knowledge and understanding straight from the Throne on absolutely everything.

Sure, what we receive won't contradict scripture, but remember this: It will contradict a lot of our theology. Understand that. What we've been taught in the church system is theology, systematic theology, which is man's system. Even if we didn't actively do a course in theology, we've spent so much time listening to pulpit teaching that we've been programmed in systematic theology. Bible references were quoted as proofs and also used to expound on, but it was man's wisdom, man's understanding, that we heard. This is even the case in the Pentecostal and Charismatic systems. (that's from my 15 years of experience in those systems)

If philosophizing is a search for the truth, then that's what we should be doing. Jesus' way, the Kingdom way, of doing this is to be in total connection with the Throne of God. In every situation and every circumstance we receive Heaven's input of knowledge on it. Now, this can happen automatically, in the fact that we're in a certain position or we're thinking about something, and it just drops into our spirit. If it doesn't, and it's essential, then we need to ask. This is not a call for prayer time. Just ask. For example, "Lord, I've just been told by so-&-so about such-&-such and such-&-such. What's your mind on that?"

That's the simple questioning we should use, and we'll get an answer. If we can't hear through the Spirit, then we may not hear anything. It requires practice to hear at that level. But Jesus told us – and it's recorded in the Gospels – that if we ask, we'll receive. We think this just refers to physical things, but that's a religious way of thinking. If we want to know anything, it's best to ask the person who knows all about it, and that's the Trinity.

For me, what I've discovered is that when I'm in the presence of the King, especially in the morning when I have my time of drawing from his life (drinking of his Living Water & feasting on his Living Bread), that's when I get a lot of my downloads. And, I've come to expect them. Take this morning, for instance. During that time of refreshment, my mind drifted towards a unit that I have to teach at college, one I'm having difficulty with. It's the first time I've had to prepare for a new version of this unit, and I needed practical activities that fitted in with the new unit guidelines. As I was in this time of being in the presence of the King, I was downloaded three or four different inspirations outlining what I could do. It wasn't while I was sitting doing the preparation work for the unit, it came supernaturally when I just thought about it. I didn't have to go into a prayer time or a time of fasting and demand that the Lord give me inspiration. That's because I'm always looking for the truth and I'm always looking to Heaven to supply truth and reality – as well as wisdom, knowledge and understanding. I'm just being given what I need.

It doesn't matter what the topic is, whether it's a life issue, a Kingdom understanding, whatever it happens to be. While ever I'm in the zone, as they say, while ever I'm attuned spirit-to-spirit with Heaven, as soon as I think about a thing and mull it over, I get solutions, I get knowledge, I get inspiration, I get revelation. Like today, with this message, I got it as a download. It just flowed. This is what I mean by Kingdom philosophizing. You come into the presence of the King, into Father's presence, and just live there, and when a thought pops into your mind that you need an answer for, it just gets supplied.

So the truth or the facts that I'm searching for is just given to me automatically. Ninety-nine percent of the time I don't have to ask. I only have to ask when it's a topic that somebody wants inspiration on, or Heaven's perspective on, and then I might ask. But my practice is to just think about it, focus on it, and I get it.

From my spiritual experience, you'll need to try it for yourself. Of course, if you're scared to do it because you've been told that the Bible is the only source of knowledge, then you won't step out. This will stunt your growth and your maturity. You won't be able to operate as a son in the way you've been designed to do – you'll be limited and less than effective. From what's been revealed to me, you won't be able to enter the destiny that Father has for you, the one that you were given before you entered the body you're in at the moment. That's because you don't have the knowledge that allows you to move forward to where he wants you to be, and to do what he wants you to do. Because of your autonomy as a person, you will resist what he wants you to become in your spirit, and you'll also resist in your heart and mind. Sure, there will be church things that you will ascent to, but that's not necessarily where your destiny is. In fact, for most of us, our destiny isn't as a professional Christian. Surprise, surprise!

So there you have it. Kingdom philosophizing is not a term that I use at all, but I wanted to use it here. I wanted to get across the idea of thinking about a topic and searching for the truth as your heart attitude, and allowing Heaven to supply it. Any topic. Any topic in the world or in the universe, you can get the information about it straight from the Throne.
