

Prisoners of War

Our King has made it very clear that in these Last days of incremental warfare those who don't get themselves freed from their hurts and pain (their emotional baggage) will be taken prisoner by the enemy very quickly. It's time to start using appropriate spiritual and natural weapons for your own protection.

Wendy Alec was shown in a vision Christians who were kept prisoner by the enemy because they hadn't cleaned up their lives of unrighteous attitudes and behaviours. This gave demons access to their mind and emotions so they were tormented until they gave up following Jesus.

"As I looked further, I saw thousands of men and women who seemed to be prisoners, walking or shuffling around the perimeter of huge barbed-wire fences.

Their prison uniforms resembled those of a Second World War concentration camp, but their uniforms were not all the same.

The prisoners on the left side of the camp had both their hands and feet shackled by heavy chains.

In fact, the iron chains weighed them down to such an extent that they shuffled rather than walked.

Many of these prisoners were stooped and bowed, almost doubled over.

As they shuffled and limped along in an unending, aimless single file past the perimeter, I could see signs on their backs but could not read them clearly...

But it was the prisoners' faces and bodies that caught my attention.

Their faces were horribly contorted and twisted. And in their eyes was a terrible rage and fury that they should even be there as prisoners. Their limbs were, without any exceptions, completely twisted and knotted; their hands were misshapen and crippled.

Then I saw hunchbacks, many, many hunchbacks.

As I studied them more intently, I suddenly realized that the misshapen hunches had not actually been intended as part of their bodies and I now could read the signs on their backs – BITTERNESS, WRATH, UNFORGIVENESS, SEDITIONS, CLAMORING and SLANDER...

Jesus closed His eyes for a brief moment.

"He is a prisoner of war. He has been taken captive by the enemy. In his agony of soul at being overlooked and in his isolation, he quickly started to lose sight of the courts of Heaven and eternity and fell into a deep, deep depression. I sent some of My servants to deliver him and to lift him out of it, but he quickly came to the place where in bitterness of soul, he refused all offers of help. Then, because of that same bitterness, the demons started to torment him day and night, telling him that I had abandoned him."¹

In a vision, Rick Joyner was also shown a prison full of people who were trapped because of fear which made them blind. They were unable to see spiritual reality.

"Suddenly, I was in another place. I was standing in a large prison yard. There were huge walls such as I had never seen before. They extended for as far as I could see, hundreds of feet high and very thick. There were other fences and razor wire in front of the wall. Every few hundred feet there were guard towers along the top of the wall. I could see guards in each one, but they were too far away for me to see much about them.

It was gray, dark, and dreary, which seemed to perfectly reflect the mass of people who stood in the prison yard...

As I looked more closely at these people, I could see that they all had deep wounds and many scars from previous wounds. Except for the children, they all seemed to be nearly blind. They could only see well enough to stay in their own group. Even with their own groups, they were constantly trying to see the differences that others might have. When they found even a small difference, they would attack the

one who was different. They all seemed hungry, thirsty, and sick...

As I walked toward the fences, I could see holes in them that would be easy to climb through. When I reached the wall itself, I found it so irregularly built that it was easy for me to climb. Anyone could easily escape, but no one was trying because they did not know that they were captives...

I walked along the top of the wall until I reached the guard post. I was surprised to find the guard dressed in a fine suit with a collar indicating that he was some kind of minister or priest. He was not shocked to see me, and I think he assumed that I was another guard.

"Sir, why are these people in prison?" I asked.

That question shocked him, and I watched fear and suspicion come over him like a blanket.

"What prison?" he replied. "Who are you talking about?"

"I'm talking about those people in this prison yard," I said, feeling a strange boldness. "You're obviously a prison guard because you're in a guardhouse, but why are you dressed like that?" I continued.

"I am not a prison guard! I am a minister of the gospel. I am not their guard – I am their spiritual leader. Son, if you think your questions are funny, I'm not laughing! This is not a guardhouse – it is the Lord's house!" He grabbed his gun and seemed ready to shoot at me...

As I stood on top of the wall between two guard posts wondering about all of this, I felt the presence of Wisdom².

"You must return to the prison yard. I will be with you. Know that you have the vision to escape any trap or weapon. Only remember that fear can blind you. As you walk in the faith that I am with you, you will always see the way to go. You must also be careful to reveal your vision only to those to whom I lead you. Vision is what the guards fear the most.""³

Fear, hurt, emotional damage all allow the enemy to capture Christians.

Here are some essential spiritual weapons to defend yourself from being captured. You may not recognise any of these as essentials that you have been taught:

- Identity is your sonship;
- Judge yourself;
- Listening only to the Spirit (the King's voice)
- Reject every form of fear;
- Get healed quickly of wounds caused by others;
- Don't live by your emotions;
- Forgive quickly and completely;
- Exonerate perpetrators;
- Focus on Kingdom positives;
- Kill any bitterness;
- Don't give a foothold to self-pity;

You are the master of your destiny. It's all up to your decision-making how your life progresses and how you end up. Don't blame anyone else.
