Example of error:

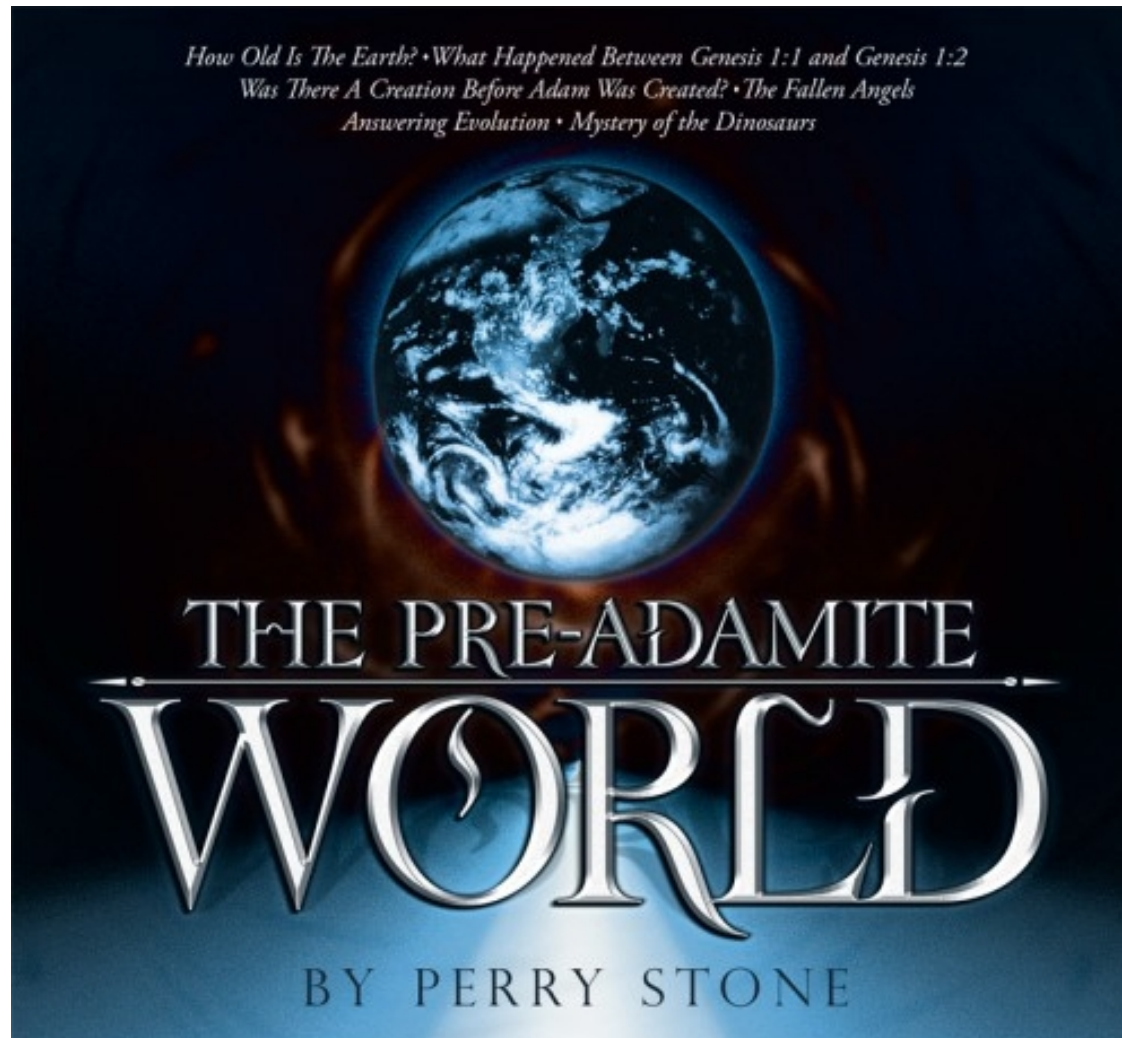
Bible doesn't say "the earth became waste and void" as some people state, but "was waste and void".

Genesis 1:2

Example of error:

Bible doesn't say "replenish the earth" as KJV, ASV & MEV state, but "fill the earth".

Genesis 1:22, 28



This is where the pre-adamite teaching originates

Example of error:

Wherefore I take pleasure in weaknesses, in injuries (insults), in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

2 Corinthians 12:10 (ASV)

Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

2 Corinthians 12:10 (KJV)

Example of error:

This word "weaknesses" is from the Greek word "astheneia" meaning "want of strength". The KJV translated this word "infirmities", but the same Greek word in many other places, including this text, is translated "weak" or "weakness".

(e.g. 1 Cor. 1:25; 2 Cor. 11:29; 2 Cor.12:9,10; 2 Cor.13:4).

Example of error:

‘Astheneia’ in the following verse shows us that "infirmity" is a bad translation.

“the weakness of God is stronger than men.”

1 Corinthians 1:25 (ASV)

Example of error:

Paul makes a list of what he calls weaknesses. He lists things such as shipwrecks, prisons, persecutions from enemies, and stripes.

Not once does Paul mention sickness in the list.

Example of error:

Now we know that God is not infirm or sick so this word has to be "weakness".

This is dishonesty in translation for the purpose of making one's own doctrine.
