

Vision of the Withered Bride of Christ

Jennifer Toledo had a vision of the Bride of Christ who was deformed.¹ Nearly half of the Bride's body was crippled and atrophied from excessive lack of use. Her muscles were sagging and shrivelled on the unused parts of her body, and she could hardly move around due to this muscle malfunction. It all made her look ugly.

Jennifer asked the Lord what the vision was intended to reveal to her and this is what he said:

“When children and youth aren't empowered to function within the Body and aren't being used and valued, My Bride is left looking like this”²

According to the statistics put out by the UN in 2011, 1.85 billion of the Earth's population of 7 billion are children under 15 y.o. Another 1.2 billion are between 15 and 24 y.o.a. Therefore, 43% of the world's population are youngsters or youth and that means that a large chunk of the worldwide church are in the same age bracket.

Why aren't we plugging into this resource? Jennifer explains:

“In our culture it's common to believe that we adults have something to teach the children and that we should instruct them so one day they can contribute to the Kingdom. But we are missing a huge piece of the puzzle with that kind of thinking. Yes, it is absolutely true that we need to teach and train children. But children already bring something to the table. They are already carrying God's DNA, and we need them – not just later, but now!”³

Children have the same Holy Spirit as adults do⁴ – not a cut-down version. They also come into the Kingdom as sons, like adults do, where we find that we're all equal.⁵ So why do we treat them as ignoramuses and relegate them to Sunday School and colouring-in? See this article for the answer.⁶

It's time to start focussing on children as a valuable part of the community. They need to be baptised in the Holy Spirit and disciplined like everyone else. A Spirit-filled child is just as Spirit-led as any adult because it's the Spirit that's in control, not the immature mind.

You need to read Jennifer's book to see how children with their simple faith can do greater works than adults. That's because they don't need to gee themselves up to allow the Spirit to move through them.
