SUMMARY²

John 14:12 (NKJV) – *“Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father.”*

1. Good leaders employ others; great leaders deploy themselves and others.
2. The greatest act of leadership is mentoring.
3. If what you learn, achieve, accumulate, or accomplish, dies with you, then you are a generational failure.
4. The greatest obligation of true leadership is to transfer your deposit to the next generation.
5. Leadership success is measured by the success of your successor.
6. If you don't produce a successor, you are a failure.
7. If your vision dies with you, you've failed.
8. Legacy is about living beyond your grave.
9. Legacy is about producing people who are greater than you.
10. Leadership is not an individual sprint; it's a marathon relay race.
11. The key to the relay's success is not winning your leg; it's successfully passing the baton.
12. At the end of a relay no one person wins; everyone wins.
13. The minute you hit the age of 40, it's time to start passing.
14. The ultimate goal of true leadership is not to maintain followers; it's to produce leaders.
15. True leadership measures its success by the diminishing dependency factor of its followers.
16. The ultimate measure of true leadership is the ability to leave. (Matthew 17:17)
17. True leadership makes itself increasingly unnecessary.
18. You are successful leaders when your followers can lead others.
19. The first act of a true leader is to identify your replacement and begin mentoring them.
