"Weeping & Gnashing of Teeth"

Most Christians would say:

"Weeping and gnashing of teeth in outer darkness! That is obviously a reference to suffering eternal physical torture in hell."

Is that so?



Get this

Weeping and gnashing of teeth was an expression <u>not</u> of tormented pain and anguish.

It was an ancient euphemism for rage.

Stephen's Martyrdom

When they heard these things they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed at him with their teeth.

Acts 7:54 (NKJV)

'cut to the heart' = furious

Jesus used this expression

Matthew 8:12; 13:42; 13:50; 22:13; 24:51; 25:30

Luke 13:28

Matthew 8:12

(Jesus Heals a Centurion's Servant)

...while the sons and heirs of the kingdom [the descendants of Abraham who will not recognize Me as Messiah] will be thrown out into the outer darkness; in that place [which is farthest removed from the kingdom] there will be weeping [in sorrow and pain] and grinding of teeth [in distress and anger]. (AMP)



This is about the removal of the OC from the Jews.

It has nothing to do with eternal punishment.



Matthew 13:40-43

(The Parable of the Wheat & the Tares)

So just as the weeds are gathered up and burned in the fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send out His angels, and they will gather out of His kingdom all things that offend [those things by which people are led into sin], and all who practice evil [leading others into sin], and will throw them into the furnace of fire; in that place there will be...



Matthew 13:40-43

...weeping [over sorrow and pain] and grinding of teeth [over distress and anger]. Then the righteous [those who seek the will of God] will shine forth [radiating the new life] like the sun in the kingdom of their Father.

(AMP)

Matthew 13:49-50

(The Parable of the Dragnet)

So it will be at the end of the age; the angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw the wicked into the furnace of fire; in that place there will be weeping [over sorrow and pain] and grinding of teeth [over distress and anger]. (AMP)



Again, "the end of the age" (aeon) is the end of the OC age.

This is about the removal of the OC from the Jews and the introduction of the NC.

It has nothing to do with eternal punishment.



Matthew 22:13-14

(The Parable of the Wedding Feast)

Then the king said to the attendants, 'Tie him hand and foot, and throw him into the darkness outside; in that place there will be weeping [over sorrow and pain] and grinding of teeth [over distress and anger].' For many are called (invited, summoned), but few are chosen."



Many were called into the Kingdom of God in the OC, but few were acceptable.

The end of the OC saw the chosen ones come in through the NC.

It has nothing to do with eternal punishment.



Matthew 24:50-51

(The Parable of the Fig Tree)

The master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour of which he is not aware, and will cut him in two and put him with the hypocrites; in that place there will be weeping [over sorrow and pain] and grinding of teeth [over distress and anger].

(AMP)



This is just another of the many parables Jesus spoke to the Israelis about his unanticipated return to bring judgement.

So, the end of the OC saw the destruction of many Jews in the Roman siege.

It has nothing to do with eternal punishment.
