

How do We Access the Abundant Life of the Kingdom?

[Based on a transcript of my teaching which was recording]

Let me start by asking you a question. Do we have the mind of Christ? Do we think like him?

Christianity teaches us that we do, because the Bible says so.¹ The facts are: our spirit is born again, but our mind and our heart and our soul and our body aren't. They need to be brought into alignment and under the control of our regenerated spirit. Then we can live as Kingdom citizens, as sons, as we're supposed to.

A case in point. Mike Parsons was shown nine paradigms which he used to assess, evaluate and process all the data that came into his brain.² This was shown to him in a visitation from the Lord. The nine "pillars" of thinking that he was shown were:

1. Sola Scriptura (The Bible is the sole infallible rule of faith and practice)³
2. Evangelicalism
3. Protestantism
4. Augustinianism (The theology of St. Augustine)⁴
5. Greek thought
6. Hebrew thought
7. Scientific rationalism
8. Cultural relativism
9. Humanism

The Lord asked him if he wanted to have those demolished so that he could think as a son is supposed to think. He agreed, and those nine pillars that supported his thinking were demolished, and he began to think like a new species⁵. He began to think like Adam did before The Fall, and it was amazing, absolutely 'out of the box'.

So because we've been trained to think certain ways, that doesn't mean to say that the Kingdom or the spirit realm operates that way. This is because we've been taught from the mind of men, from the pulpit, from books. We've even been taught their method of interpreting Scripture.

So how do we access the abundant life of the Kingdom?⁶ Most people for the last 2,000 years haven't been able to do it because they thought it was being connected to a church organisation, or by being totally sold out and enthusiastic for Jesus. Some have thought that it was being a missionary overseas, spending your life serving others. For others it was being advanced in the gifts of the Spirit. But the Lord is releasing us knowledge today of how we can access his abundant life because most people have never tasted of it. Jesus the man did. He lived that abundant life, and he made it available for us through the work that he did with his death, resurrection and ascension.

You see, it all comes down to understanding the reality of the spirit realm and what it means to be in a spiritual kingdom – the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth.

Here's a case: Jesus said he was the bread of life,⁷ and we need to eat of him. So what the church has taught us is that we do one of two things: (1) We take communion as often as possible and eat the bread, which is him⁸; or (2) We read our Bible because that's the "food" that we're supposed to consume every

day.⁹ But Jesus is the bread of life. What we have to do is draw food from him – he will supply that food he said we needed. We’ve missed this because we’ve come up with religious ideas rather than connecting with the spirit realm and understanding how things are done spiritually.

Second case. Jesus said he would supply “living water”.¹⁰ He said this to the woman at the well in Samaria, telling her she’d never thirst again. How many Christians are drinking of it? Jesus promised that it was available to us, so how do you drink of this living water? Well, it’s definitely not drinking the wine at communion, and it’s definitely not drinking holy water. You only imbibe living water when you draw or drink from the King.

In both these cases we have to learn how to eat and drink spiritually. And because we’ve been raised in a religious system we do it symbolically, but the Lord is showing us today that we have to draw them from him. This is the absolute essential feature of the Internal Kingdom – that is, the throne of the King inside each of us. This is where the supply of Heaven comes. Unless our Internal Kingdom is functioning properly – through intimate relationship, through friendship, through sonship, through spiritual connection – the spiritual food, the spiritual drink that we need cannot be passed on to us.

Jesus said, if we seek first the Kingdom, he will supply all our needs.¹¹ But how many people are having all their needs met when they’re doing their Christian ‘thing’? To achieve this supply you have to focus on the King and the Kingdom, and be about Father’s business, and all out of your connection to the Internal Kingdom. Everything flows out of the Internal Kingdom into the world around us because we carry the King, and wherever he is, that’s where his Kingdom is. So if we want the abundant life that he said he would supply, then we have to draw it from him, just like the living bread and the living water.

So it’s pretty simple. Focus on getting the Internal Kingdom working properly in your life. Make the Internal Kingdom the source of all your supply for every area. Draw from him all your emotional, mental, physical, spiritual, financial, relational, health and love needs. Draw everything from the Kingdom. Practise it and practise it. Come into his presence and draw from his supply of food and his supply of living water, and see your life change. Abundance will come. It may not be abundance in goods or finance, but it will be definitely abundance spiritually, because life, real life is in the Creator.

In conclusion, I’ll answer my first question: Do we have the mind of Christ? It’s patently obvious to every believer that they don’t think like God thinks, if they’re really honest with themselves. So we don’t have his mind, in that, we don’t think like him all of the time. However, we do have access to his mind. If the King resides on his throne in our lives and we are completely submitted to him, he gives us his way of thinking. The technique then, is to ensure that our Internal Kingdom is functioning properly and that we make our mind subject to our own spirit. This will allow his Spirit to communicate with us on a constant basis so we speak and think what he wants. This is another example of really understanding how to live in a spiritual kingdom rather than in religion.
