Your eschatology a directly impacts theology



What you believe about the Law, the New Covenant, Israel, end times, the Bride of Christ, & even eternity

Our interpretation of the book of Revelation influences a lot of our theology, but we don't know that it does

# We stick to our 'pet' interpretation and resist having it changed – for some unknown reason

It's time to remove it from its prominence by discarding what we doggedly believe and moving on with what Heaven is trying to get our attention on



## Check this out

This is a revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave him so that he might show his servants what must very soon take place.

Revelation 1:1 (PHILLIPS)

## "This is a revelation"

There isn't a definite article here in the Greek

### **According to Bible Gateway:**

- 44 translations have "the revelation"
- 6 translations have "a revelation"
- 2 translations just have "revelation"

This is inferred. It's not in the Greek

## Which one you subscribe to makes all the difference



## "revelation from Jesus Christ"

There is no preposition here in the Greek

### **According to Bible Gateway:**

- 50 translations have "of Jesus"
- 7 translations have "from Jesus"
- 3 translations have "showed to Jesus" (or similar)
- 2 translations have "that Jesus Christ revealed" (or similar)

## Which one you subscribe to makes all the difference



"which God gave him"

i.e. Father

i.e. Jesus

## Have you 'seen' this before?



"that he might show his servants"

i.e. Jesus

i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> century believers

## Not show 'himself', but Father's message



## "what must very soon take place"

#### **According to Bible Gateway:**

- 40 translations have "soon"
- 12 translations have "shortly"
- 5 translations have "quickly"

Take note of this

## So, it was not a long time in the future – e.g. 2,000 years away



## Check out Revelation's introduction in the Classic Amplified translation

[This is] the revelation of Jesus Christ [His unveiling of the divine mysteries]. God gave it to Him to disclose and make known to His bond servants certain things which must shortly and speedily come to pass in their entirety. And He sent and communicated it through His angel (messenger) to His bond servant John, who has testified to and vouched for all that he saw [in his visions], the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. ->

Blessed (happy, to be envied) is the man who reads aloud [in the assemblies] the word of this prophecy; and blessed (happy, to be envied) are those who hear [it read] and who keep themselves true to the things which are written in it [heeding them and laying them to heart], for the time [for them to be fulfilled] is near.

Revelation 1:3 (AMPC)

## So, you must decide who or what is being revealed to John

This determines what <u>you</u> think Revelation is all about, not what it really <u>IS</u> about

So, don't be dogmatic about what you think Revelation is all about.

Allow Father tell you what you need to know about it — after all, it originated from him.
