

We Need to Complete Our Kingdom Apprenticeship

On the 1st of July this year I had dropped into my spirit the sense that each of us must fully complete our Kingdom apprenticeships. This is vital for our growth & development in the Kingdom, as well as our ability to enter our destiny.

By destiny, I don't mean the destiny that we think God has for us. NO!

Our true destiny is the reason we were placed on Earth. This destiny was given to our spirit-man by Father before we left Heaven and were placed in our human body. This was given to us as a "destiny scroll" according to those who have been taught by the King while inhabiting Heaven. This type of destiny is a different concept to the one we were encouraged to fulfil by the church system. For all the good intentions of the pastoral counselling we received, aligning with the Kingdom so that we enter our genuine destiny is the key to our future. All the teaching we had on following our gift cluster or our gifting was in vain. We can only find our destiny by hearing from Heaven and being trained for it through our Kingdom assignments.

It's critical to add that we need to realise that we won't be released into our true destiny until we have been fully trained by our King in an apprenticeship that lasts for years. If he reveals to us what our destiny is, we can choose to enter it before we are ready, but we will not be totally successful. Grace abounds for all those who are spiritually reborn, but this is not an indicator that we are on 'the right track' to fulfil our destiny.

When a follower of Jesus makes life choices outside Father's will (instead of doing what Father wants¹) there is a grace that is released on the person's circumstances which causes Heaven's blessing to continue, but in a limited way. This is due to Father's love for his Son's people, not because he approves 100% with what they are doing and becoming.

Don't confuse grace for approval.

We human beings have been given autonomy and a free will by our Creator. This came with our lineage from Adam who was the first human and the one who was the first son of God² in the natural. Because of this endowment we can make our own choices, but we still have to put up with the consequences of each one of them. We can pray all we like and demand that situations and circumstances change, but if we are out of alignment with Heaven we are asking wrongly. Our proper response is to totally surrender everything to our King and allow him to rearrange our lives so that it will allow us to enter our divinely appointed destiny.

When we are all in our destiny or on-track to it, that's when the Kingdom advances at tremendous speed. If our strong desire is to see the Kingdom advance and the world change for the better, then it's patently obvious what each of us needs to do: Complete our apprenticeship no matter how long it takes and enjoy the process.
