

Speaking from a Kingdom Paradigm, not a Biblical Paradigm

Now that you've listened to this audio session you realise that it was spoken from a Christian perspective, a biblical perspective in particular. Neville (who is now deceased) was still in the church system as a senior leader when he produced this talk which is why it is so heavily Bible-based. So, even though he is Spirit-filled and receives dreams, visions and prophetic revelations, his basis for explanation is scripture.

In the Kingdom, as sons in spiritual communication with the King, we must be able to talk, teach, coach, instruct, disciple, as well as preach to those outside the Kingdom, from our position as a son. This means we not only need to remove all religion and legalism from our lives, we have to be reprogrammed to talk like a son. Remember that Jesus of Nazareth is our prototype, the first member of the new species. If we learn to be like him, we will:

- Speak what Father gives us;
- Become one with the Trinity;
- Commune with each member of the Trinity;
- Not quote scripture when we speak all the time;
- Be in 'the presence' all the time;
- Not have to be 'psyched up' with worship singing before teaching or preaching;
- Not have to twist God's arm in prayer sessions to get what we want;
- Not have to have Daniel fasts or 40-day fasts to twist God's arm to get what we want.

Jesus demonstrated these and we need to get to the place where we operate the same way.

Now, what I've done below is redo Neville's 24-minute talk as a 1½-page Kingdom-based lesson. Read it and see if you can tell the difference.



On August 7, 2011, I had a dream. In the dream I was about to preach to a vast audience when a man came up onto the stage and said he wanted to say something. I escorted him off the stage, but he kept coming back and demanding to be heard. The final time I had to use my force to get him off the stage and he stopped and turned to me and said, "I'll be back". I pointed my finger at him and said in a really loud voice, "NO!" and he fell over dead. I thought I had killed him, but I returned to the pulpit. A strong anointing came on me and I began to speak on 'The New Creation Man' – i.e. who Christ is in us. Then I woke up.

I knew the dream was from God and that the vast number of people represented the world. The man who interrupted me and wanted to be heard was the old nature ("the old man").

At the age of 130, Adam produced a son, Seth, in his own image and likeness.¹ Seth was different to his father, because Adam was made in the image and likeness of God. Seth was produced as a replica of a fallen human, not a spiritual god-man like his father was. The rest of humanity, as descendants of fallen Adam, are produced in the image of fallen mankind. Now, it's a spiritual principle that 'clean' things (i.e.

righteous things) can't come from 'unclean' things (i.e. unrighteous things), they have to be cleansed to be transformed. In this way fallen humans are 'polluted' and cannot become righteous (i.e. holy or sanctified) unless they are cleaned up. They cannot do it themselves, it has to be done by God himself.

God's solution for restoring fallen humans was to start a new race of humanoids (human-like beings). He did this by sending his son (a spirit) to Earth in the body of a human. This man could not be formed from the genetic material of a fallen man and woman, he had to get his genes from elsewhere. The new humanoid had to come from a human being, but it had to have no connection to fallen human genes. This was achieved by the spirit of God miraculously providing the genetic material, ex nihilo, to create the zygote of a new type of living being. God chose a young virgin named Mary to be the surrogate to carry this new creature until birth. The pregnancy was successful and the being was born and was named Jesus. He was spiritually the son of God, but he was in the likeness of a human.

Jesus was a new creature, not a normal human being. He was perfect in his foundations – spirit, soul and body. Adam was the first perfect human and Jesus was Adam mark II, a second version of the first one. From him was to start a new species of humanoid, similar to, but different from fallen mankind. This is who we are as a result of Jesus coming – one of these new species of humanoid.² This new person is created in us when we are spiritually reborn at our conversion to Christ, when we acknowledge what he did for us in paying the price for the Fall and accepting his Kingship over all realms. We become a new man in whom the old person has become acceptable to God despite our fallen bodies, mind and soul.³ We don't become exactly like Jesus until we die and lose our mortality and are given our regenerated bodies, just like Adam's originally was.

We are not a perfect human-version-2 like Jesus was, because only our spirit is regenerated. As a consequence, we still have to deal with the fallen parts of our being, as well as live in a fallen world, with fallen people and fallen nature. This produces problems for us. Firstly, we must realise that there is nothing in our fallen nature that is pleasing to God, so it must not be our focus. Secondly, because we have lived up to our spiritual rebirth through our fallen nature, this part of us will continue to want to be in charge of our lives. Thirdly, there will be a life-long battle to allow our new nature to supplant our fallen nature.⁴ This battle is caused by sin which is still resident in the fallen person, even though we are a new species. Why? We will not be perfect until we have lost our fallen components which is everything other than our spirit. So, our renewed spirit wants to follow things that are righteous, but our base nature (our fallen nature) wants to be in control, making us sort of schizophrenic (bi-polar, split-personality). This is a bigger issue than we would expect because the enemy uses our minds to tap into our fallen nature unbeknown to us, making 'headwind' for our growth in the Kingdom.

Every single person is born with a fallen nature and needs to have it regenerated so they can come back into the Kingdom of Heaven. Even John the Baptist who was filled with the Spirit in his mother's womb still needed to be regenerated by the work of Jesus. Every person's mind needs to undergo renewal because it is not regenerated during re-birthing. Our fallen wills need to be surrendered to God because they will follow the base nature (the "flesh"). Even Paul who was 'born-again' and baptised in the Holy Spirit needed to have every part of himself brought under his spirit and under Holy Spirit.⁵

We need to say, "NO!" to our old man, to our fallen nature, so that it's killed off. We have to personally make the choice to do this, by faith, just like it needed faith to come into the Kingdom. This is a constant process, not a once-off action. Our fallen nature is opposed to God and cannot please him. The more we say, "NO!" and choose righteousness, the more of the old nature is put to death. God adds his power to this process⁶ of saying, "NO!" but it's always under our will, all of the time. It's also the knowledge of the benefits of the Kingdom life that helps us reject the old nature, because the old nature wants what it sees

and desires all the time. As we constantly live by our spirit we can live in the benefits of the new nature.⁷

Killing our old nature⁸ releases God's grace to us to go further. But the key is to allow the King to live his life through us from inside of us – from the Internal Kingdom.

This new species of humanoid is going to be showcased to the world and to the powers of darkness in this new era of the Kingdom. But the key for this to happen is that each one of us needs to make a choice to live from the spirit, and not the old nature. Others will begin to see what Heaven is like in us as we mature and reveal who we really are – sons of the Most High God.



We need to be able to talk to people about any topic, but it must be through the paradigm of the Kingdom. You may not say what I have written about the new species we have become, but you must be able to do it without relying on Bible quotes. You must be able to hear from Heaven and be able to speak as the Spirit gives you the inspiration or the exact words to say.

This is part of our training so we can be manifested as Father's sons, just like Jesus of Nazareth did.
