Both these teachers show that:

1. Father's primary goal is to develop each of us into another Son to work for him on the Earth (i.e. another person just like Jesus of Nazareth, the first spirit-filled human)
2. The Trinity is waiting for us to get to the point where we surrender our lives completely to them. This means totally taking our hands off our lives and circumstances.
3. They want us to operate in complete trust and let them do what they want with us, through us and in our circumstances.
4. They want an intimate relationship with us, not a transaction connection.

All this means that we need to put prayer requests in their proper perspective and make our time talking to the the Trinity a process of spiritual love-communication, not intercession.

It's obvious that we still have a great deal of reprogramming to be done in us so we align with Heaven. Only then can we grow and develop as sons and enter into our divine destiny (not the destiny we've chosen for ourselves).

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
