Good works, however, must follow the timetable of the King, otherwise they counteract his plans. This is one area we can easily fall flat on. We get a directive to do something from the Spirit, but we do it our way and in our time. That's NOT how we are to do things.

In this new era of the Kingdom, it's even more important that we fit into Heaven's timetable. We may be in a 'holding pattern' waiting for the go-ahead to begin doing the Kingdom assignment we've trained to do, but while we wait we must rest and relax.

Here's a recent reminder to do just that.

*"I speak to those who feel like a race horse waiting for the gate to open. Your prancing up and down will not make the gate open any quicker. Settle down. Conserve your strength and energy. The time will come when you can run the race again, and you will run well. Now is not that time. Be patient."*<sup>2</sup>
