

Forcing Your Agenda Will Delay Kingdom Processes

One thing we learnt some time ago is not to force the Kingdom to release what you're wanting. Whether this is a need, a blessing, an open door, Father's approval, etc., the only way to receive it is to operate by faith and rest in the supply. It's a spiritual principal that the Kingdom actually resists force and only allows release through rest and relaxation.

The other lesson that is parallel to that is the big one: What you think the Kingdom wants, you can't make it happen. Everything of the Kingdom must come from the Kingdom, be accomplished by the Kingdom, and done in the Kingdom's timeframe. Unfortunately our society teaches us to take initiative ourselves, but that's not the way that heaven's plans materialize.

Here's a reminder of this from our King:

"For everything there is a time and season. You have to keep in mind that My perfect timing is not necessarily your timing. Patient endurance is required to get through this season in divine order. Trying to force your agenda will not produce the effect you desire and could even prolong the agony of waiting. Rest assured that I will open the way of progression in due season."¹

Rest and relax in the Kingdom.

"Lean into"² what you know is available to you, don't push. It will open up in due time.
