After he defected to the US, he saw what was really going on in Western society – right back then.

We're only **now** discovering the agenda of the elite that he previously saw and warned us about.



“A decline in courage may be the most striking feature which an outside observer notices in the West in our days. The Western world has lost its civil courage, both as a whole and separately, in each country, each government, each political party, and, of course, in the United Nations. Such a decline in courage is particularly noticeable among the ruling groups and the intellectual elite, causing an impression of loss of courage by the entire society. Of course, there are many courageous individuals, but they have no determining influence on public life.”



“Every citizen has been granted the desired freedom and material goods in such quantity and of such quality as to guarantee in theory the achievement of happiness – in the morally inferior sense of the word which has come into being during those same decades. In the process, however, one psychological detail has been overlooked: the constant desire to have still more things and a still better life and the struggle to attain them imprint many Western faces with worry and even depression, though it is customary to conceal such feelings. →



→ Active and tense competition fills all human thoughts without opening a way to free spiritual development.”



“Destructive and irresponsible freedom has been granted boundless space. Society appears to have little defense against the abyss of human decadence, such as, for example, misuse of liberty for moral violence against young people, such as motion pictures full of pornography, crime, and horror. It is considered to be part of freedom and theoretically counterbalanced by the young people's right not to look or not to accept. Life organized legalistically has thus shown its inability to defend itself against the corrosion of evil.”



“Hastiness and superficiality are the psychic disease of the 20th century and more than anywhere else this disease is reflected in the press. Such as it is, however, the press has become the greatest power within the Western countries, more powerful than the legislative power, the executive, and the judiciary. And one would then like to ask: By what law has it been elected and to whom is it responsible? ... [W]ho has granted Western journalists their power, for how long a time, and with what prerogatives?”



Solzenytsen knew what was going on because he'd come out of a totalitarian communist regime.

We've been so slowly taken over by the same type of people that we haven't noticed their revolution taking place in our society – until now, 40 years later.



We've been sucked in to think it's all good, just as the Bolsheviks were hoodwinked by their master controllers behind the scenes.

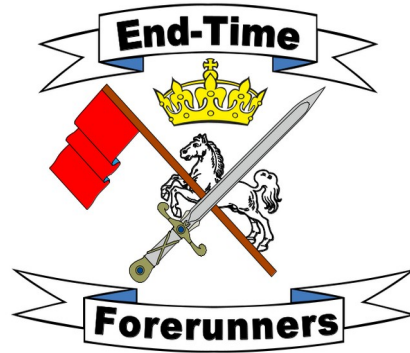
