

A Different Take On What Righteousness Is

One problem we have made for ourselves is seeing righteousness and unrighteousness in terms of good and evil. The reason we've done that is through operating out of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, rather than the Tree of Life. The Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil is the source of worldly knowledge, not the mind of the King. It's also the source of religion and theology, which are also not the mind of the King.

From his perspective, righteousness is what's right (correct) according to him, and unrighteousness is what's not. This is why he's been wanting us to align with him in every way, so we are able to intuitively do what's righteous and pleasing to him. When we have his mind on what 'righteousness' really means, our heart will change, and we'll be able to do things his way.

This issue of misunderstanding things is the same with what we think sin is. We got that one wrong as well.¹ Both problems with our understanding come from approaching Kingdom knowledge from an OT (Old Covenant) perspective.

A great burden is lifted when we understand what 'righteousness' and 'sin' really are, from Heaven's perspective.
