

# Do We Need to Learn Hebrew in the Kingdom?

The straight answer to that is, NO.

If the Kingdom is about every person from any nation or cultural group living in relationship with the Trinity and communicating spirit-to-Spirit with them, then Hebrew is totally irrelevant. If a person wants to understand the history of how things came to be in the Kingdom on Earth at this time, then reading the Bible with understanding of the Hebrew/Jewish history in the OT and NT **could** be of value. However, that would only be for interest sake, to quench the person's desire to know things which are actually outside of the Kingdom. That's similar to a person learning another language for the purposes that they desire to use it for, or for the pleasure of the challenge.

But – and that's a big BUT – learning Hebrew, Aramaic or the Koine Greek of the Ancient Near East so that the person can live in the past, rather than move on in sonship as we're meant to, would be a counter-productive move. Their life as a son would be curtailed and religion would become more of their focus, rather than living in the spirit and aligning with the King.

From another perspective, there are those<sup>1</sup> who believe that a person should learn Hebrew because they believe that language to be given by YHWH to the people. Therefore it's sacred (holy) and of vital importance in the Kingdom – or so they believe. Except, the Hebrew language is most likely an outgrowth from the language of Abraham, which was Chaldean.<sup>2</sup>
