Father Has No Favourites

Read this message from Father:

""Many of you, my children, are caught in the throes of division and mired in disagreements and disunity instead of seeking peace. I want you to remember that I have no favorites. When you are one with me, walking with me, and having my mind, you will seek to be at peace. Put aside prejudice and pride, and walk in the strength of my Spirit," says the Lord."

At the risk of being labelled a heretic, <u>Father's lack of discrimination extends to all people</u>.

That includes: those outside of the Kingdom; non-believers; those in other religions; and even not-nice people. When he deliberately made humanity – his only creation that was constructed, not spoken into existence – his product (Adam) was perfect. How can I say that Adam was "perfect"? That's easy, the Trinity only work in perfection.

The fact that the New Covenant is now in place, ratifies what I've just written. That covenant is between Father and the man Jesus who achieved what he did <u>for all humanity</u>. We're all seen as accepted through the lens of the work of the Cross, resurrection and ascention.
