

“I Want My Thoughts to be Your Thoughts and My Words to be Your Words”

It has been our understanding from the Gospel accounts that Jesus wants us to be one with him. We also know from the NT writers that our mind needs renewing so we have the King’s mind.

Today, is that what he still wants from his people? We can say, “Most certainly”, because that’s what he’s told us he wants and it’s what he’s been doing with us.

When oneness is coupled with a renewed mind that’s been deprogrammed and reprogrammed, we start to think his thoughts. It’s at that point that we can be more certain that we will speak his words, not our own. That’s why we need to assess what we speak, before we speak, so we eliminate ‘junk’ from our speech.¹

IMPORTANT: “His words” doesn’t just refer to prophecy and Kingdom teaching. ‘His word’ is what we should speak every moment of the day.

This is confirmed by what he said to us recently:

“Beloved, I want My thoughts to be your thoughts and My words to be your words. They will be thoughts and words of love and encouragement to those around you. Be done with pride and prejudicial judgment and actions, and remember that you will reap what you sow. If you want a better harvest, you have to plant better seeds.”²

When we constantly speak lovingly and encouragingly to others, the fruit is evident that we know how to speak ‘his word’. (Being able to prophesy ‘his word’ is additional to that and relates to a different matter.)
