

# Life is Meant to be an Adventure for Sons

Everything he’s been saying to us is positive, so that’s the perspective we need to see life. Negativity has no place in the Kingdom, so anything negative that we feel, should be seriously questioned.

Here’s Father’s POSITIVE attitude towards life that he wants us to take on board. It’s written in two different statements from the same source:

*“These are the days of discovery. You will discover me in hidden places and in previously unknown ways. I am calling you into new experiences, into adventures of life and spirit. Life isn’t meant to be boring and monotonous. It is yours to enjoy! I want you to ask me to lead you into these times and places of adventure—both great and small.”*

*“It’s time to step away from the security of what you’ve known. Do something new. Embrace radical change. Challenge yourself and become comfortable with discomfort. Look at fear and laugh in its face. Do things you’ve been too afraid to attempt. Separate yourself from procrastination once and for all. Take the risk. You may find exactly what you’re looking for in the very places you’ve been afraid to go. Do you feel me prompting you? Don’t ignore the nudges of my Spirit. You will find me in the most unlikely places. You will find joy in the unknown. Be bold and do something new!”<sup>3</sup>*

Isn’t it time we enjoyed life with him? You’ll find that’s what occurs once you move into oneness and live out of his life, while partnering with him in your Kingdom assignments.
