## (2016 Annual GWPF Lecture at The Royal Society, London on 17 October 2016)

"So what I am about to say this evening about the state of climate science is not in any sense antiscience. It is anti the distortion and betrayal of science. I am still in love with science as a philosophy; I greatly admire and like the vast majority of scientists I meet; but I am increasingly disaffected from science as an institution. The way it handles climate change is a big part of the reason. ## • "New study: Supernovae influence Earth's long-term climate, bio-diversity and evolution"

"A new study shows how supernovae influence Earth's climate. The implication is a surprisingly influential role of stellar processes on terrestrial evolution...Over the last two decades there has been significant progress in appreciating that cosmic rays have an important influence on the Earth's climate through their influence on the atmosphere, both on short and on geological timescales. A decade ago a connection between supernovae and life was discussed by Henrik Svensmark of the Technical University of Denmark which provided a robust assessment of the change in supernova frequency over the Phanerozoic period – the era covers the last 540 million years, the one in which animal and plant life has existed."
