

★ "Environmental Pollutant'—How a Key Climate Agenda Tool Harms Endangered Species" "As the Biden administration expands its offshore wind projects as part of its goal to reach a carbonfree energy system, whales and other marine life may become collateral damage, according to new research. Two independent studies measuring ocean wind turbine construction noise found that the sound emitted by vessels mapping the seafloor was significantly louder than estimated and that noise protection for whales and other sea creatures during wind turbine pile driving doesn't work. "David Walsh is a recognized energy expert and notes that demand for energy normally approximates to growth in gross domestic product, currently at about 1.6 percent per annum. However, Dominion Energy, part of the PJM Power Transmission Consortium that serves 13 Mid-Atlantic States and the District of Columbia, is looking at 7 percent growth per annum, according to Mr. Walsh. A significant component of the growth in demand is data centers—and the epicenter of data centers for both national and international use is Northern Virginia. The data centers in Northern Virginia direct 70 percent of the world's internet traffic. Mr. Walsh told me: "The country is woefully short of electricity now with the displacement of coal and gas by the Biden Administration... The promise of "green" or "renewable" energy will move the growth of energy in the tenths of a percentage point per annum at some distant point in the future, but the chasm of shortfalls in energy delivery through renewables is mathematically insurmountable."

 - "Opponents of a controversial plan to store waste carbon dioxide in Australia's biggest underground freshwater system say state government approval will be difficult after the Queensland premier labelled the project "not a good idea". Mining giant Glencore had been wanting its subsidiary CTSCo to store carbon dioxide from the Millmerran power station in an underground aquifer at a site at Moonie, west of Toowoomba. Queensland Premier Steven Miles said the project in the Great Artesian Basin was unlikely to get the environmental approvals needed."

 "The Australian Labor government will invest heavily in critical mineral mapping to turn the country into a renewable energy superpower and a hot spot for renewable investment. On May 7, Prime Minister Anthony Albanese announced that the government would provide \$566 million (US\$366)

• US: "After FDA Approval, States Move to Ban Lab-Grown Meat From Sale"

"Aside from the push for people to eat bugs and insects as a viable alternative source of protein, there is actually a second simultaneous push to get people to eat lab-grown meat. The thinking goes that since the world is ending due to climate change, and since the agricultural sector contributes to climate change, we can do away with farms and ranches—and replace that meat with cultivated meat grown in a lab. And unbeknownst to most people, cultivated meat has already gotten the stamp of approval from the U.S. federal government (from both the USDA and the FDA). However, since the United States is an amalgamation of 50 different states, individual states are pushing back. And along that line, five days ago, Florida enacted a new piece of legislation that bans and criminalizes the manufacture and sale of lab-grown meat within the state."

"Australian Plant-Based Meat Sales Surge 47 Percent Between 2020 and 2023"

"Australia's plant-based meat sales surged 47 percent, while per capita consumption increased 28 percent, between 2020 and 2024, according to Food Frontier in its State of the Industry report. The report evaluated the current state of the plant-based meat manufacturing industry, reflecting its economic contributions, and potential future. According to Deloitte Access Economics, total plant-based meat sales reached \$272.5 million (US\$178.94 million) last year. This is equivalent to a compound average growth rate (CAGR) of 14 percent since the 2020 financial year."
