1/ Adi Paterson reveals power bill savings from nuclear on DT front page



On Monday, Nuclear for Australia Chair Adi Paterson was featured in a front page article in the Daily Telegraph.

The article states that nations with nuclear energy had energy bills that were half of what Australians currently pay.

For example the article noted that French power bills were approximately \$449MW/h whilst Australian power bills were \$106MW/h. In France approximately 65% of their electricity comes from nuclear energy compared to 0% in Australia.

It is consistent with global evidence that whilst nuclear plants might have a high capital cost, they lower power bills in the long term.

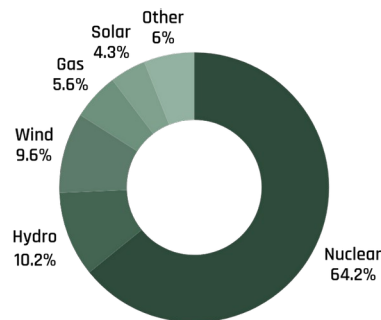


2/ Nuclear powered Olympics host

In the last fortnight on social media, we've been sharing the French nuclear experience with our social media audience in the backdrop of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

Whilst the direct electricity needs of the venues is being offset by a combination of wind and solar, 65% of France's electricity comes from nuclear energy.

The French nuclear build was called the 'Messier Plan'. Whilst the plan fell short of the original target of 80 reactors by 1985 and 170 reactors by 2000, in the end they were able to build 56 reactors in 15 years. Many of the reactors were built in 5-6 years.

It really goes to show how much we're being lied to when our politicians tell us we'll have to wait over 20 years to see a nuclear reactor in our country.
