## Some Relationships Will Fade Away



Some time around 2015, Father instructed us to connect in community with like-minded people. At that time, we'd been following Evangelical outreach principles, and trying to get as many believers as we could to join us on the Kingdom journey he was taking us on. His instruction was not what we had expected, but in a short time he unpacked it and made it clear that it was so we could strengthen each other because of the opposition that we would be facing.

The change in mindset wasn't an easy thing to do because our culture trains us to maintain friendships, otherwise we're not nice people. On top of that, Christians pressured us to stay connected with them and their organisations, saying that we were obligated to remain in fellowship. However, we moved forward with Father's instructions, facing the opposition for breaking fellowship with those who were antagonistic to what we now stood for, because of all of Father's reprogramming.

Although our souls didn't like being disconnected from others, and our minds condemned us for splitting from old friends and fellow believers, <u>some</u> of us did what Father said and were determined to handle any opposition.

Today, we continue to allow Father to teach and train us as we've not surrendered to peer pressure. It was quite satisfying, therefore, to read a recent message from Father which told us that past relationships will fade away as we move on righteously with him:

""There is a widening chasm between the righteous and unrighteous, which will change the dynamic in relationships. This interruption will continue as some people you have been in touch with in the past and present will just seem to fade away. You must rise up and walk in the divine flow of My Spirit. Otherwise, you will try to fill the void created by these changes apart from My will," says the Lord." 1

The reason his message is so acceptable now is because of our correct understanding of 'righteous' as meaning to do and speak what Father wants.<sup>2</sup> 'Unrighteousness' is the opposite: <u>not</u> doing or saying what Father wants. That also goes for what we believe and the doctrines we adhere to. Everything in the Kingdom is meant to align with Father's mind, which makes them right or righteous. Anything outside of alignment is unrighteous, but not evil.
