

The Kingdom Link Between Imagination and Creativity

*(Part 3: This article is an expansion of Esther's interactions with Father, following on from the previous two)*¹

Imagination and Creativity

Father dropped this information in my spirit:

- Imagination is a tool that he's given us, and just like any tool, we, his sons, need to learn to use it, and use it well, for his Kingdom.
- Imagination is his creative power working through our imagination.
- Co-creating with him can only come through imagination that has been legitimised through our complete trust in him.
- Creativity can come only from within a peaceful person.
- Anything is possible with our creativity, if we are at peace.
- Stress blocks creativity because it eliminates peace.
- Lacking peace and Father's love can affect our imagination.

Thoughts are Important

Before beginning to paint a picture, an artist would have to think, and plan the steps, the tools, and the colours they would need to paint it. Imagination would come about when the artist begins to visualise it in their head and then they would begin to paint.

Father impressed upon me that thoughts are very important because they are the beginning of our imagination and our creativity. We always begin with thoughts, and then our imagination comes when we begin to see it in our mind, and in our heart.

Father emphasised that our thoughts and our imagination are powerful. Both are always at work, for good or for bad, for creating or for destruction, for hope or for despair, for building or for pulling down, for life or for death.

Legitimate Imagination

We are one with Father. Therefore, in him, we live, we move, and we exist. And, when we walk in unconditional love and total peace (in a place of complete rest in him), our imagination is purified and legitimised. Lacking peace and his real love can affect our imagination.

His love and peace enable us to embrace and welcome anything and everything that comes our way. It's not limited to good things, but includes everything. We are to set King Jesus as our supplier and learn from him.

Creativity comes from a state of being at peace with Father, and with oneself, and from a love walk with him, being intimate and in oneness with him. As a result of these, we have total confidence in him, and then in ourselves, to create. When we have total confidence in him, we have no need to fret, worry, stress, or fear – he's our supplier.

Not a Fantasy, but Faith

Faith comes by hearing what's spoken and that's Father's words to us.² Those words are 'seeds' which enable our hope, desires, thoughts, dreams, plans, and visions to 'germinate', and our imagination to be legitimised.

The ‘seeds’ of his words to us, cause our imagination to be built on the revelation of who King Jesus is. Therefore, our dreams, hopes, plans, visions, imaginations, expectations, anticipations, and even our participation, is made by faith, not fantasy. And, because we have faith, that faith enables us to have purified, legitimate imagination.

Father reminded me of the stories of Rahab, Ruth, Joseph, Esther, and many others, whose own imagination was built on the revelation of who God is, how it helped them to walk in the purpose and destiny that he had for them, and to receive their own miracles and deliverances.

When we put our total, confident, trust in Father and what he’s said to us, the ‘seed’ of faith will be planted, and we will see our imagination grow and develop.

Most importantly, Father also impressed on me, that we need to allow our mind to be transformed so we use our imagination to envision ourselves as he sees us, to see how much he loves us, and to see what he meant when he said, “I give you abundant life”. Do not allow our accustomed survival mode, the disappointments, fear, doubt, the mundane, the impossibilities, the failures from the past, the ongoing circumstances, the routine habits, or the familiar teachings that we have been taught, to set the limitations of our co-creating with him.

Father said, “Dream bigger dreams, impossible dreams, outrageous dreams! Why limit yourself? Why stop yourself when I have already given you the tool to co-create for me? No more limitations! Dreamers will not be ‘looked down on’ in Heaven. The foundation that you’re going to stand on tomorrow, is built on your dreams and thoughts of today.”
