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## SOURCE FILE: "Living as a New Species"<sup>ii</sup>

1. Knowing that we are a new species, and when we live like that, and we also live as a Kingdom citizen, we won't be phased by the world around us. You'll be able to live in any type of society, and it will not change the way we operate. It will not impact our heart, our soul or our mind, because we're established (stable).<sup>iii</sup>
2. We live in the world as a different species, impacting it with the Kingdom, but our Kingdom life isn't impaired by the world system.<sup>iv</sup>
3. Major shakings and catastrophes won't cause us to falter because our personal intimate relationship with the King is so strong and so real (not just knowledge), and our experience of totally relying on him for everything, allows us to handle whatever comes our way.<sup>v</sup>
4. That's the reality of life in the Kingdom, which is right in front of us.<sup>vi</sup>
5. Jesus is our prototype, our benchmark. He's the one we have to aspire to become as he was.<sup>vii</sup>
6. We work towards that by allowing ourself to be moulded, shaped and changed; allowing ourself to be tested and tried; allowing ourself to experience assignments of varying levels; of focusing on our Kingdom life; of positioning ourself to be the new species that we really are.<sup>viii</sup>
7. That functionality is not unattainable for us.<sup>ix</sup>
8. It is wrong to think that Jesus of Nazareth was able to operate as he did because he was God. That's wrong thinking. He gave up his divinity and operated as the very first new species, and the first Spirit-filled human being<sup>x</sup>
9. We need to operate in meekness like Jesus. Meekness is not using our Spirit-power when we don't need to, because we submit everything to Father and we do what he wants.<sup>xi</sup>
10. We hold ourselves up from operating like Jesus did.<sup>xii</sup>

vii – “Jesus is our prototype, he’s our benchmark. That’s what we have to aspire to – and I don’t mean aspire by desiring to – ... ”

viii – “...but by actually working towards it: Allowing yourself to be moulded, shaped and changed; allowing yourself to be tested and tried; allowing yourself to experience assignments of varying levels; of focusing on your Kingdom life; of positioning yourself to be that new species; to be Jesus as he was.”

ix – “It’s not unattainable.”

x – “It’s not unattainable. We can think it is because we’ve been taught that Jesus was a God-man, but the God part of him was his spirit that was in him. He gave up his deity and he did everything as a human being, as a new species, the first new species since Adam. We see it in his response to Pilate where he said that he had the potential to wipe him out, and Rome as well. But he didn’t, because he had a purpose... We’ve got to get beyond seeing Jesus as a God-man and seeing him as the first Spirit-filled powerhouse that we are to aspire to.”

xi – “Because of his relationship with Father and because the angelic realm knew who he was in the spirit they could’ve wiped out all opposition to him. But he chose in meekness (because that’s what meekness is, not using your power when you don’t need to) and he submitted to what Father wanted.”

xii – “The challenge is there. We’re the hold-up. We are stopping ourselves from becoming who Jesus was.”
