

What Are Firebrand Warriors?

(This is a message I received in my spirit. It is a warning to be careful of absorbing natural attitudes from life in society and applying them in our spiritual lives. Constant self-checking is vital.)

If you frequent prophetic social media sites you'll have come across the expression "firebrand warriors".¹ But what actually are they?

Most likely, our imagination will produce a mental picture of a "firebrand warriors", such as a samurai or one of the three musketeers. If we do get that idea in our mind, we can quickly think we need to be *gung ho* believers chasing down and eliminating false prophets like Elijah did and laying waste to all opposition.



But, hold on. Is that what a "firebrand warrior" is? To answer that question, we need to take a step back and make sure we measure what we think these are against everything Father has been teaching us so far about our sonship and kingship. If what we think a "firebrand warrior" is doesn't align with what he's told us, then we have to discard our erroneous thoughts, so we don't get out of alignment with him. After all, it's very easy to go on a crusade because human nature is always looking for a major 'life project' or a worthy cause.

To get the right idea of a "firebrand warrior", let's look at Jesus of Nazareth, our prototype. He's the one who Father told us to model ourselves on. Was he one of these samurais or musketeers? No he wasn't. But, from a Kingdom standpoint, Jesus was a firebrand warrior, but his life didn't mimic one of the ones from our adventurous imagination.

Like those who think a Christian woman needs to be a warrior leader like Deborah, one who takes charge and rides roughshod over all those who resist her, we are prone to let our imagination rule our sensibilities. That, of course, takes us out of alignment with the Trinity and outside of the Kingdom. That's because anything man-made doesn't belong to the Kingdom.



No wonder there's a large contingent of Christian eco-warriors and climate activists. We've picked up on the societal narrative that we can change the world through people power and we think that's how the Kingdom works. It simply doesn't.

One thing I learnt some time ago is that the Kingdom doesn't work through pressure. It actually opposes pressure, and instead, works through rest. That means any pressure doesn't belong to the Kingdom of Light, so it must originate in the Kingdom of Darkness – there's no alternative source. That should be obvious to us because control and manipulation are also features of the enemy's kingdom.

How easy it is for us to get sucked into believing something, without checking it out with Father?

If we're going to learn to be kings, we can't take on the world's ideas or become a Christianised King David. If we do, we'll neutralize our power and authority. That's because being kings is a spiritual role and the Spirit won't allow us to abuse our status in this era of the Kingdom's history on Earth.

What I've been writing about here is MIXTURE.

In conclusion, when we see “firebrand warrior” written down or a prophetic message given about them, we must make sure what we take away from it is only what the Trinity want for us and their plans on Earth. We cannot create our own version of a “firebrand warrior” as it will remove us from supporting the Kingdom and make us antagonistic towards it.

That may be hard to receive, but it's in the same theme in what Jesus meant when he said that a person who's not for him is against him. Drilling deeper, that even includes those who align with his name, but whose heart is not completely for him.
