

What Else Prevents Us Entering Into Deep Oneness?

One would expect sin to keep us from oneness with the Trinity, but because we are sinless in their sight through the Son's sacrifice, this can't be a big issue. I believe it's our heart that determines whether we're able to or acceptable to engage in oneness. Everything comes from the heart, and it's the heart that they choose to assess. But what is it in our heart that inhibits us?

For a start, we know that loving the things of the world works against entering into complete oneness with the Trinity.¹ That's a heart condition that's not compatible with them, so it is to be expected.

Father shed light on this question for Kriston Couchey. He was shown that pride, propensity to judge and taking offense are three important inhibitors. Here's what he was told during an encounter with Father:

"Father spoke in great tenderness, "The condition on the plain has not changed, it is your heart that has changed. When you first observed the chaos of the plain and the side of my mountain you held within your heart judgment, offense, and anger toward humanity."

*"In your pride you harbored offense towards the world and those who claimed to know me yet wounded and opposed you out of their own unmet needs. This **pride, judgment, and offense were the very things that kept you from oneness with Me** and kept you from seeing people the way I do. When you died to your pride, judgments and offenses you were then able to see things through my eyes of love."*²

These three are heart attitudes, so it's quite clear that we must watch over our heart if we are to make more progress in the depth of our oneness. We can't have any restrictions there because we are unable to enter into the fullness of what we're expected to do while we're outside of complete oneness.
