

You Don't Have to Fix Everything All at Once

Despite the pressure that religion puts on believers to be holy, Father doesn't apply any of that pressure to us. That reality is most probably a shock to my readers, but the reasons are very simple:

1. What Jesus has done for us has already made us holy. We're consecrated¹, which means we're holy in his sight. It doesn't matter what we think about ourselves, or what others think.
2. We don't need to strive to be perfect. He knows we can never be perfect while ever we live in our mortal bodies.
3. Father wants us to deal with our issues with his help. We don't have to do it on our own – that's categorized as 'works'.
4. The Spirit helps us by changing us from the inside out. It's our heart and attitudes that need to change, so we can then manifest the right way in the natural, in the way Father wants us to.
5. The plumbline for knowing what's right and wrong for us is 'righteousness'² – nothing else. Righteousness is what Father determines is right in any given situation.
6. Being changed 'from the inside out', is done one issue at-a-time, not in bulk. There's no pressure to do that from the Trinity.
7. Father is content that we are wanting to change, but not that we want to be perfect.
8. Father's and the King's attitude towards us doesn't change because we have issues, or that we have difficulty eliminating them. Unconditional love ignores that. Our incorrect thinking comes from the human psyche³, not our spirit.

As the source of truth is King Jesus himself, and as his Spirit leads us into all truth, it's instructive for us to receive a download on this topic so we are quite aware of his mind on this:

*"Be careful that you do not get overwhelmed. **You do not have to fix everything in your life all at once**. You have time to sort out your issues thoughtfully and come to a logical conclusion. Your strength will be in your ability to have patience."*⁴

Notice that he says we don't have to fix all our issues in large numbers – work on them one at a time. We need patience for that, as well as endurance, and maintaining our peace and rest during the processes.
